



BORROWED WALL ART PRIZE

Liverpool City Library (Council) is seeking entries from young artists aged 18-30 for its *Borrowed Wall Art Prize*.

Council's vision for the future is for Liverpool to be a vibrant city of opportunity, prosperity and diversity. Reinvigorating the cityscape into a lively and dynamic public space is a key component of Council's aspirations, rooted in its strong tradition of supporting the delivery of quality artworks and art experiences.

The second *Borrowed Wall Art Prize* will reinvigorate the library Youth Space. A central area for young people to meet, socialise, game, study and seek refuge; the design will transform the space.

ARTWORK BRIEF

The design should reflect young people living in the Liverpool LGA and relate to the contemporary library experience. The library is no longer just a place of books, it is an immersive vibrant cultural space where the diversity of the community is celebrated. The artist will develop a design to install in the Youth Space as well as deliver 2 workshops to local young people.

The winner of the *Borrowed Wall Art Prize* will receive:

- (a) a \$10,000 cash prize, and
- (b) a \$10,000 budget for the complete installation of the artwork.

HOW TO ENTER

To enter the *Borrowed Wall Art Prize* entrants must submit the following:

- (a) a completed Entry Form,
- (b) proof of payment of the Entry Fee,
- (c) a two-page CV,
- (d) up to two images of each artwork in a high resolution digital format, and
- (e) proof that the artist is 18-30 years of age at the time of artwork installation (e.g. drivers licence).

Note: The dimensions of the external window are: 2.2m height x 21m width.
The dimensions of the framing wall are: 0.75m height x 79.6m length
The artwork must cover the entirety of the window and internal and external framing wall.

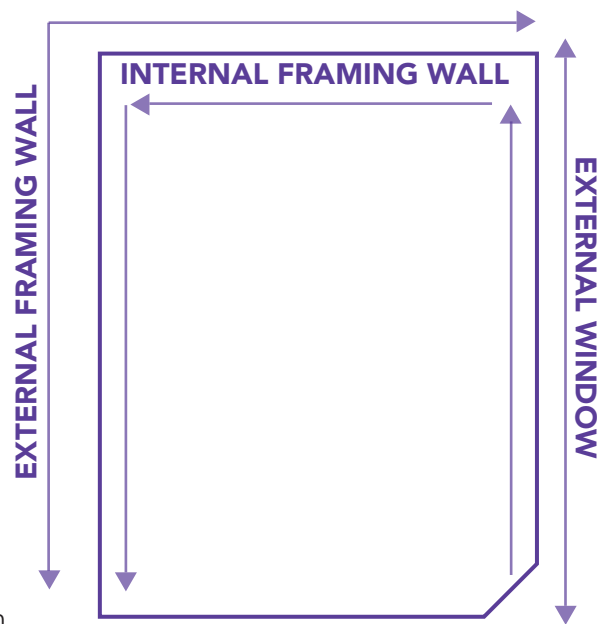
TERMS AND CONDITIONS

All completed entries constitute an acceptance of the Terms and Conditions of the Borrowed Wall Art Prize.

1. The competition is open to people 18-30 years old. All entrants must be 18-30 years old at the time of artwork installation.
2. All entries must include a completed Entry Form, up to two high resolution digital files of each artwork, a two-page CV, proof of payment of the Entry Fee, and a copy of a proof of age document.
3. Each artist can enter a maximum of two artworks, with a maximum of two images per artwork.
4. Recommended digital files are JPEG or TIF files on CD, USB or sent via email. Additional images or media will not be accepted or viewed.
5. Any work for which the fee has not been received will be ineligible for the prize.
6. All entry fees are non-refundable and assist in administrative and exhibition costs.
7. Council will not be responsible for any late, lost, misdirected, incomplete or incorrect entries.
8. Any costs incurred by an entrant in any way associated with the preparation and submission of an entry will be entirely borne by the entrant.
9. The decision of the judges will be final and binding upon every entry.
10. Artworks selected for the Borrowed Wall Finalists Exhibition will be shown on screens in a continuous loop in the Liverpool City Library during opening hours. The exhibition will run from 14 – 29 April 2018.
11. All artists must be available during the artwork installation period of 26 March – 13 April. Any artist who is unavailable will not be considered for the prize.
12. The winning artist must deliver 2 workshops with local young people during the installation period (2 workshops organised by Liverpool City Council, Duration: half day/ workshop, Materials: provided by Liverpool City Council)
13. The winner retains ownership of Intellectual Property and Moral Rights of their entry and to the artwork.
14. The winner grants Council an irrevocable, non-transferable and royalty-free licence to photograph and publicise the artwork.
15. The winner will liaise and co-operate with relevant Council staff to prepare the site and install the artwork.
16. The winner understands that the *Borrowed Wall Art Prize* is a temporary commission, and their artwork will be replaced by the winning entry of the following *Borrowed Wall Art Prize*.
17. The winner will be engaged by Council on a Visual Artist's Agreement, which will require the artist to adhere to all of Council's Work Health and Safety policies.
18. The winner will be available for media and marketing requests in the lead-up to the launch of the *1st Borrowed Wall Art Prize* and two months following this.
19. The winner will be allocated a budget of \$10,000 for complete installation of the artwork. Council will retain any unspent funds at the conclusion of the project.
