
Sign in

Home page

The home page is very simple to make it as easy to use as possible. In the centre, as the focal point, there is a search bar and an explore button.



Under this, there is a list of available areas to explore specific topics or activities.



Search

Click on the search bar and start typing in a topic. It will bring up suggestions that might be what you are looking for.



Select the right term or press enter, and it will bring you to a list of articles with that term referenced, in order of relevance.

Explore

Click on Explore to browse areas of interest.




This will take you to a more narrowed list of subjects.



From that, you'll be brought to a list of articles, arranged alphabetically.

Articles

After selecting an article from either the Search or Explore functions, it will immediately take you to the page. From there, you can read the whole article, but if looking for a specific area within it, there are some helpful links. In the top right corner, there is a link to Contents.



Next to that, there is an icon that brings up some options for different Tools. The most useful ones are Citations to credit work for school assignments, Translate if you need to change it to another language, and Read aloud to adjust how the article is spoken aloud if you select the speaker icon.



At the top left corner, there is a set of icons that help you navigate the additional information about the topic. The first one is a page with lines on it, and this is the article itself. The checklist leads to the Curriculum Standards page. The camera leads to a picture gallery. The i icon leads to a list of related articles, websites and lesson plans.



Navigating pages

On any page, if you click the blue back button in the top left corner, it will take you back one page.




Pictures and Videos

Just select two animals and hit Compare Now!


Activities




Important People

Science Projects

The science projects section leads you to different types of projects that can be done to learn more about science.



Click on How to do a science project before starting any projects, as it provides useful information on how to be safe and smart.

Dictionary

If you find an unfamiliar word in any article, you can double click on it to search the dictionary.

This dictionary shows you how to spell words, what the words mean, what part or parts of speech they are, how to separate the words into syllables, and how to pronounce the words. In addition, you will almost always see how a word is used in a sentence or phrase. Many times you will also discover words that have the same, or nearly the same, meaning, as well as words that have the opposite meaning. There are also hundreds of pictures to help increase your understanding.
