



Clarity English: Clear Pronunciation


Clear Pronunciation is the beginning of your English-speaking journey. It helps learners recognise and pronounce the forty-three (43) sounds of English through audio, video, and interactive activities.

You can choose from three models: Australian, British or North American English, watching and listening to native speaker examples from those backgrounds.

Please note that Clear Pronunciation must be used on a computer or a phone that has a microphone to do the activities.

Logging in

To access <u>Clear Pronunciation</u>, click on the link and provide your membership number (from your card, starting with 2000, or if you signed up online, your member number starting with C).



The first time you use Clear Pronunciation, you can register yourself and sign in to keep track of your progress. You can also choose to just continue as a guest if you do not want to track your progress.



As Clear Pronunciation is by Clarity English, you can use your sign-in across all the other Clarity English products.



Select Create an account the first time and fill in your email and create a password. You will need to enter the password twice.



It will then allow you to sign in with that login.

Introduction

The first time you log into Clear Pronunciation, a video will pop up. This covers what you will learn in the course, what accent you should choose, what is a phoneme, what is the IPA, and what vocabulary will you need. Watch the video to understand all these questions and their answers to be ready for the course.


Press Play (the white triangle) to start the video.



Once you have watched the video, click on 'Start the course!'.


Home page

Once signed in, the page will open to the lesson menu. At the top, you can choose between consonants, vowels, and diphthongs (combination of two vowels). Underneath that, you have different sounds you can learn.




Starting a course

Once you have clicked on a lesson, the first page will provide you with a list of what activities to expect in this unit.



Click on the activity you want to do. Most activities start with introducing sounds. You can watch the video as many times as you need until you are confident in repeating the sound in different words.



Press the play symbol (either a white triangle on video or blue triangle in white circle) to listen to the sound. When you are ready to record yourself saying the words for the activity, press the microphone symbol.




Activities may change with each unit. Most involve listening to a sound and either choosing an answer or recording yourself. At the top of the page, you will see Marking, Start again, and Next.



Start again resets all your answers without checking if they are right.

Marking tells you what you got wrong. If you made any mistakes, Start again will change to Try again. You can press that to keep the answers in place but move them around until you think you got them right. You can take as many tries as you need.



You can move to Next at any time, even if you did not get 100% correct.

You can leave the unit at any time by clicking the Home button in the top left corner. At first, it will take you to the unit activities, but if you keep clicking on the green house, it takes you all the way back to the first page.



Phonemic Chart

From the home page, you can find link to a phonemic chart at the top of the page.



Phonemic Chart

This opens a PDF that lists all forty-three (43) sounds of the English language. The first page of the PDF includes examples of the sounds in a word, while the section page is only the sounds without examples.

Progress

From the home page, you can also find a progress report at the top of the page.



This lets you see how you are doing.



- Coverage tells you how much you have done.
- Compare shows how much you have done compared to other users around the world.
- Analysis tells you how much time you have spent.
- Score Details tells you how you went on the activities.
- Certificate lets you download a certificate to show you have completed all exercises in a level once you are finished.
