Developed by the BBC, MUZZY's simple and effective program works by teaching languages through fun and animated stories featuring Muzzy and friends. These stories use the natural immersion method, which is modelled after the way children learn their first language. Each lesson serves as the foundation for the next. The object is to build on the words and concepts that your child previously learned.

It offers Spanish, French, Italian, German, Chinese, Korean and English.

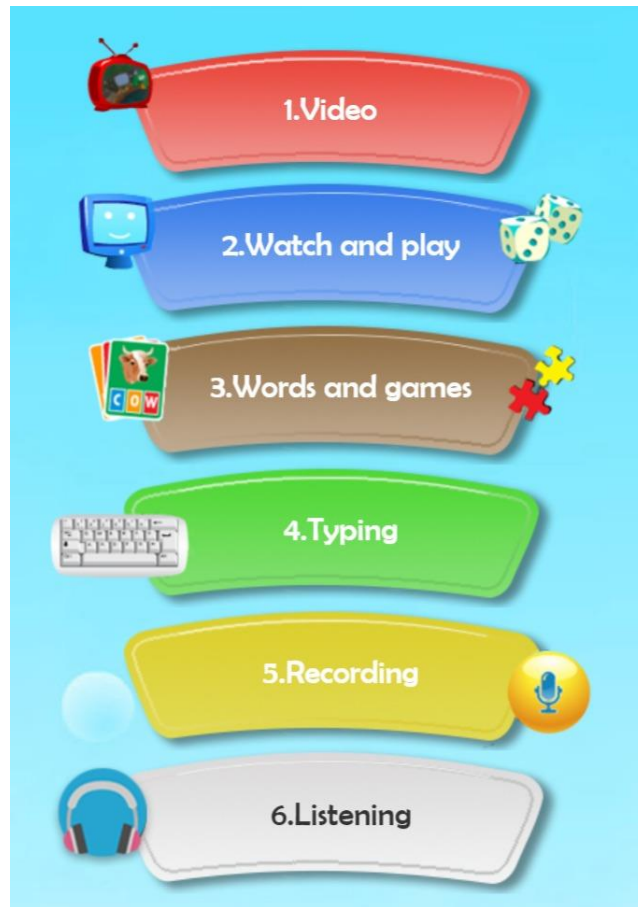
You then select the language of choice.

Starting lessons

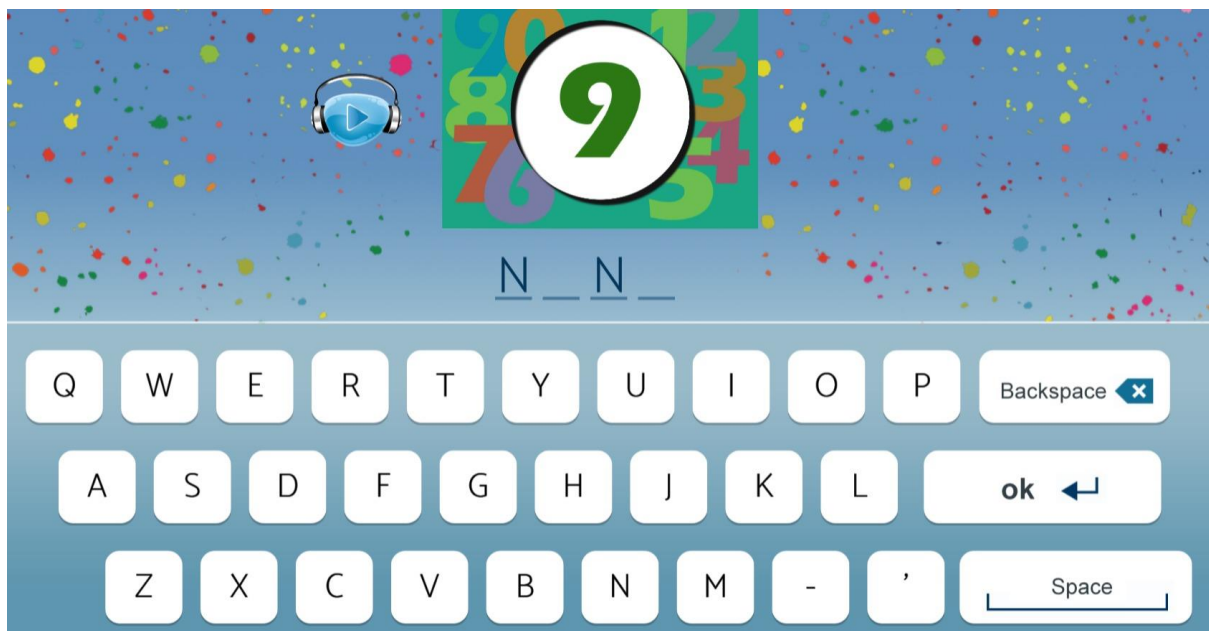
Once you've chosen the language you wish to study, you'll be offered the units. Start from Unit 1, and move up the levels.
