

Collingwood House Project Based Learning

What is the significance of Collingwood House in the history of Liverpool? Who were the people who lived there? What industries were based in the area? What was life, like in the area before colonisation? These are some of the questions students can answer through our Collingwood House Project-Based Learning program.

In this program, students will choose an area of focus that they are curious about and become historians by exploring Collingwood House, learning research skills, listening to, and questioning an expert on the topic, and gaining presentation experience.

What is Project Based Learning?

A program where "students work on a project over an extended period that engages them in solving a real-world problem or answering a complex question. They demonstrate their knowledge and skills by creating a public product or presentation for a real audience. As a result, students develop deep content knowledge as well as critical thinking, collaboration, creativity, and communication skills." https://www.pblworks.org/what-is-pbl

The program runs with interactions* with museum/ library staff for up to 4 visits, with students working independently on their project in the time between the site visits.
