Providing nearly 170 years of coverage, this ProQuest collection includes the two leading Australian newspapers: The Age (1854–2000) and the Sydney Morning Herald (1831–2000).

Both newspapers are considered two of the most influential Australian newspapers and have been labeled Australia's newspapers of record. With these newspapers, gain insight into politics, business, culture, sports, and more throughout Australian history.


Logging in

To access Historical Newspapers: Australian Collection, click on the <u>link</u> and provide your membership number (from your card, starting with 2000, or if you signed up online, your member number starting with C).

Searching


It is easiest to narrow the database before you search. Using the Change Databases tab in the top right corner, unselect the databases that you do not need to search and select Use selected databases.



You'll then be brought to the specific search bar for just that database.



Use a simple search by typing in any keywords. This will bring you to a list of results.



Use the filters on the left side if you need to narrow down the date and click on a title when you've found an article you wish to read to be taken to the full text replica of that page. You can use the arrows to turn the pages of that issue.




In the top right corner, you have several options. Download a PDF copy of the page, generate a citation for a bibliography, or email or print the article.



If you wish to do another search, click on the three lines in the top left corner to find the links to the search bar.



Using Advanced search allows you to combine search terms and dates at once.




The results list will work the same as for a simple search.

Browsing


On the top left corner, you'll find Publications. Click on that to get a list of publications offered by ProQuest.



You can either browse by title or search for the title name. This will bring up a list of results.



Click on the title to search within the article or choose a date for an issue. Clicking View issue will bring up a list of articles in that issue.



Click on the article heading to be taken to the full text replica of that page.
