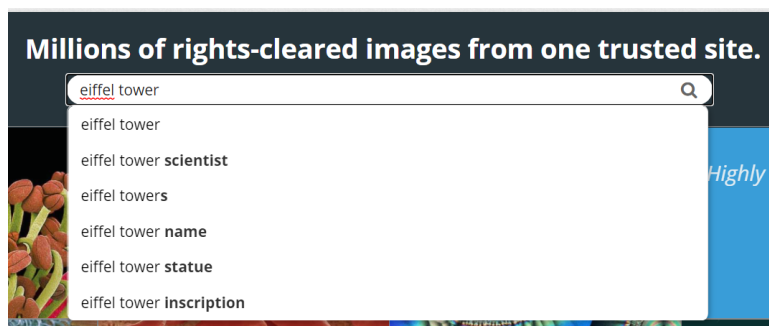
To access Britannica ImageQuest, click on the [link](#) and provide your membership number (from your card, starting with 2000, or if you signed up online, your member number starting with C).

### Eiffel Tower

The Eiffel Tower was designed by Alexandre Gustave Eiffel (1832 - 1923) for the Paris Exhibition of 1889. The tower is a 984 ft (300 m) high open-lattice steel structure located on the southern bank of the Seine River in Paris, France. In 1909, the Eiffel Tower was almost torn down but was preserved for its antenna. Subsequently, the tower was used for the International Time Service, French
