Transparent Language Online teaches over 110 languages. This includes English as a Second Language. It has tourist and beginner levels for all languages. Some languages have advanced and professional levels.

Transparent Online teaches listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills.

There are mobile apps for iOS and Android devices.

You will need to use a phone that has a microphone to do some activities.

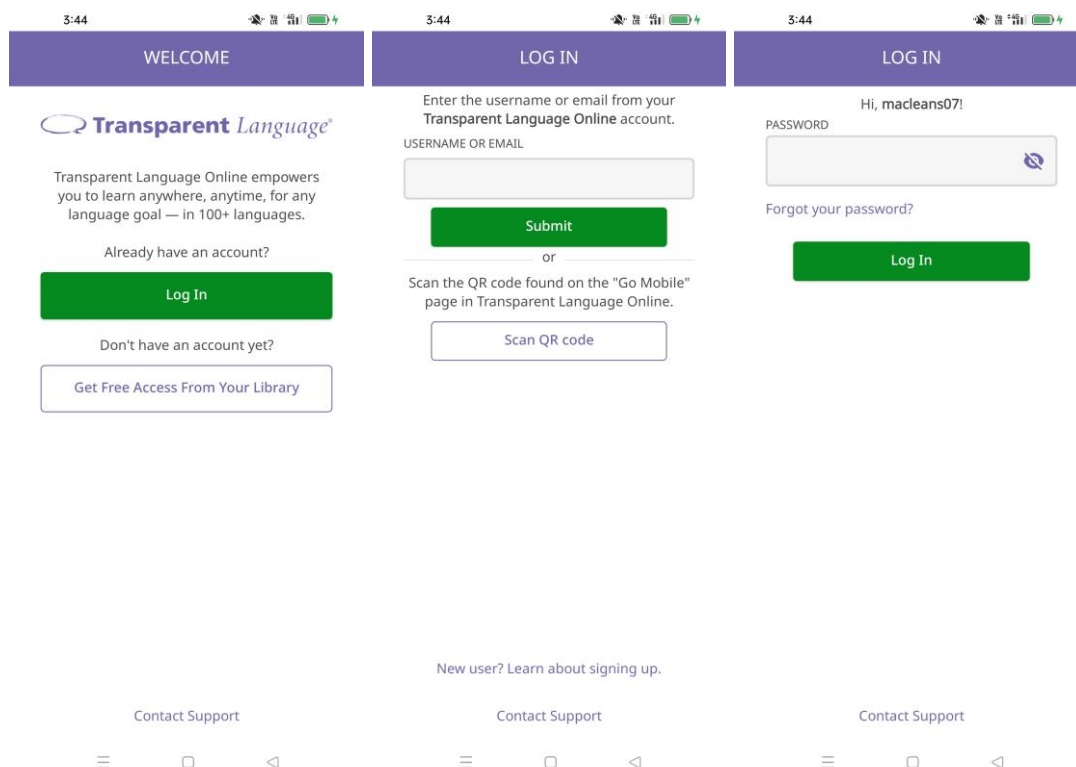
Logging in

Home page

It will run a tutorial the first time you use it. It will point out different features that you might like to use. Press **Continue** to go through the tutorial, or click on the cross icon to quit the tutorial.

On the home page, you have different sections. The first section is My Personal Goal. This lets you set how much time you want to study. It also shows how many days you have used Transparent Language in a row.

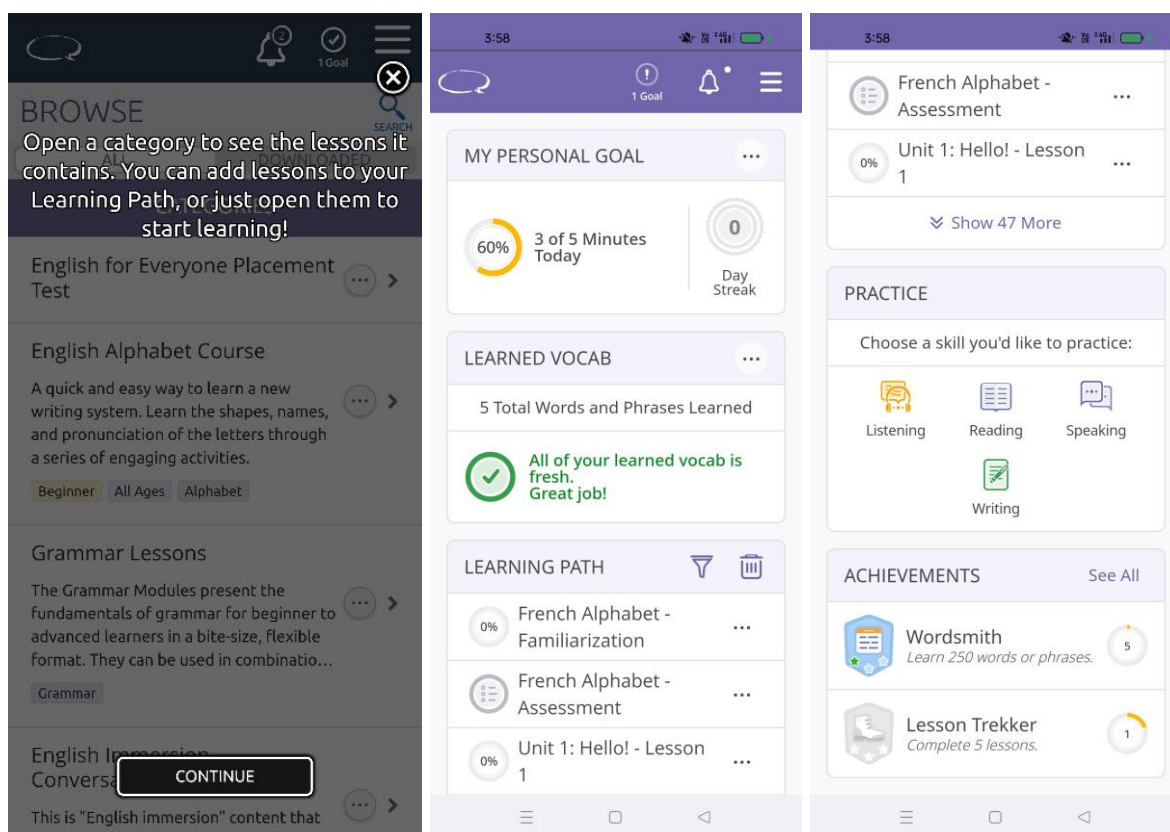
The next section is Learned Vocab. Learned Vocab adds new words from your lessons. You can add new words you learned somewhere else.

The main section is the Learning Path. This is where you find your lessons and tests.

Practice lets you practice different types of activities.

Achieves shows badges that help motivate you. When you have reached a milestone, you get a badge.

Go to the Learning Path to start learning the language.



Starting a lesson

Tap on a lesson or test from the Learning Path. It is usually best to start from the beginning, but you can skip activities if you want to.

The first page of lessons will usually cover what you will learn. Click on Start Learning at the bottom of the page to begin the lesson or activity.

Activities may change with each lesson. Some involve choosing an answer, clicking on a word and dragging it to the right place, or typing the answer in. Other questions will ask you to listen and record your answer.

You can take as many tries as you need. You can move to the next activity at any time, even if you did not get 100% correct.

Click Menu to skip to different activities in the same lesson.

Completed lessons will be ticked off.

At the top of the home page, you can tap on the three lines in the top right corner to open a menu.

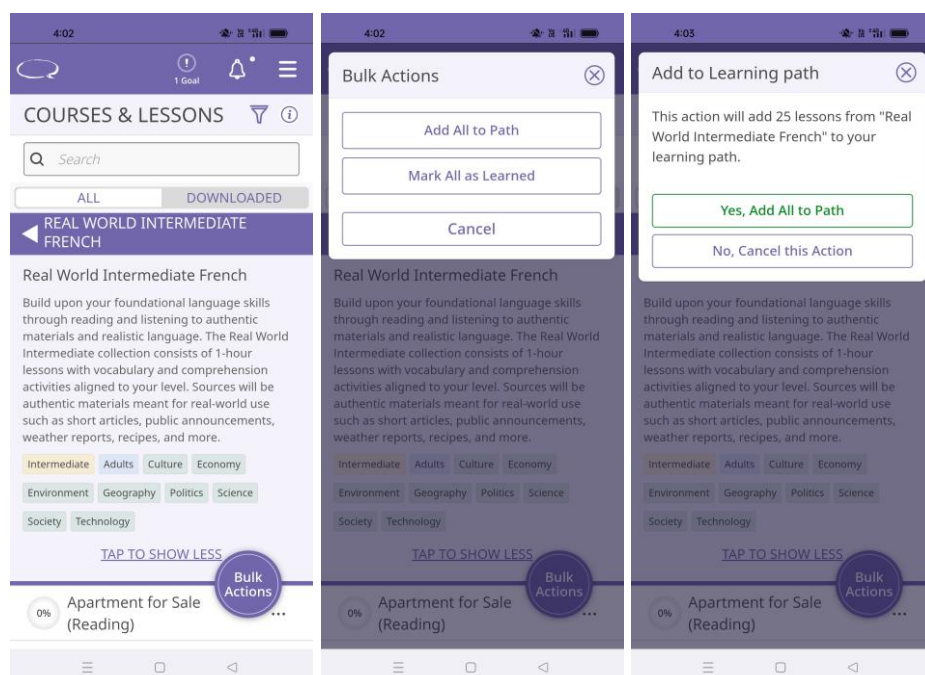


There might be more lessons for your language, including advanced lessons. Click on **Courses & Lessons** to see what other courses are available for that language.

You can tap on a course to find more information about it. You can also start the course by tapping on a lesson.

Tap on **Bulk Actions** and then **Add All to Path** to add the lesson to your Learning Path on the home page.

It will ask you if you are sure. Tap **Yes, Add All to Path**.



My Transcript

Under to Courses & Lessons in the menu is My Transcript. You can check your study progress here. Progress means how far you have gotten.



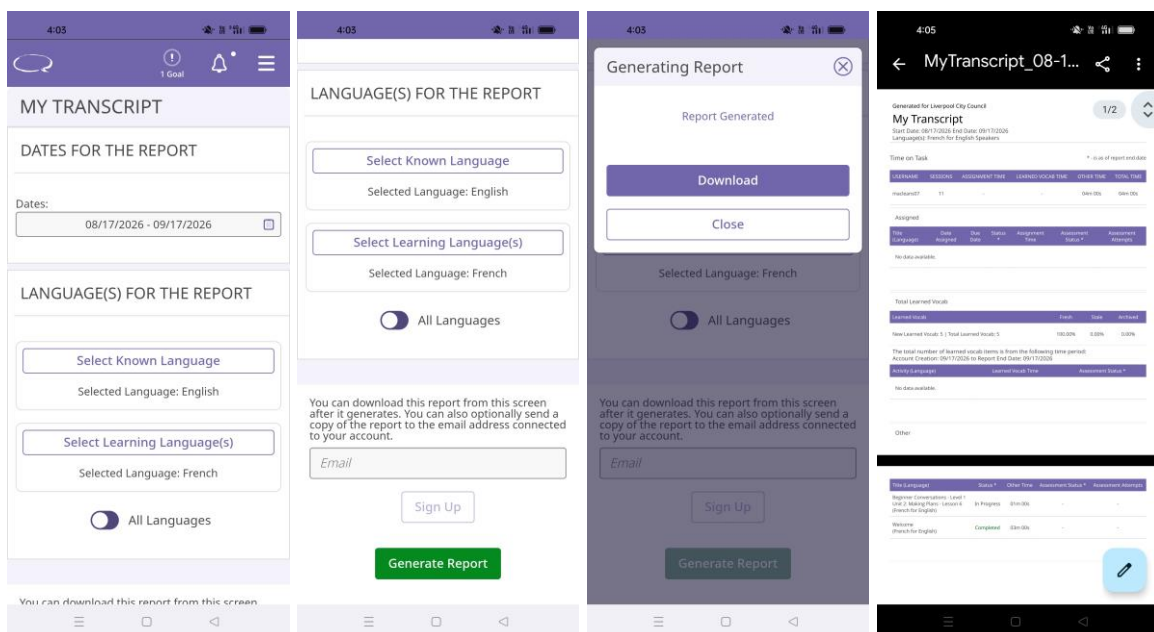
You need to choose what dates to check your progress between.

You also need to choose which language to check.

You can, if you want to, email the report to someone.

Click **Generate Report** to see your study progress.

Click **Download** to read the report. This report includes time spent, number of words added to your vocabulary, and more.

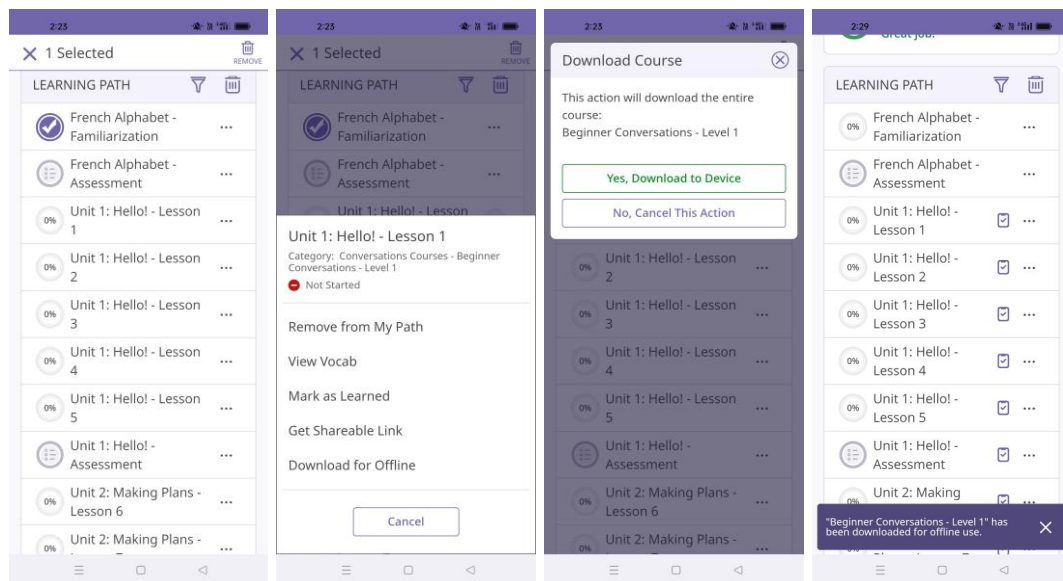


Hands-Free Autoplay

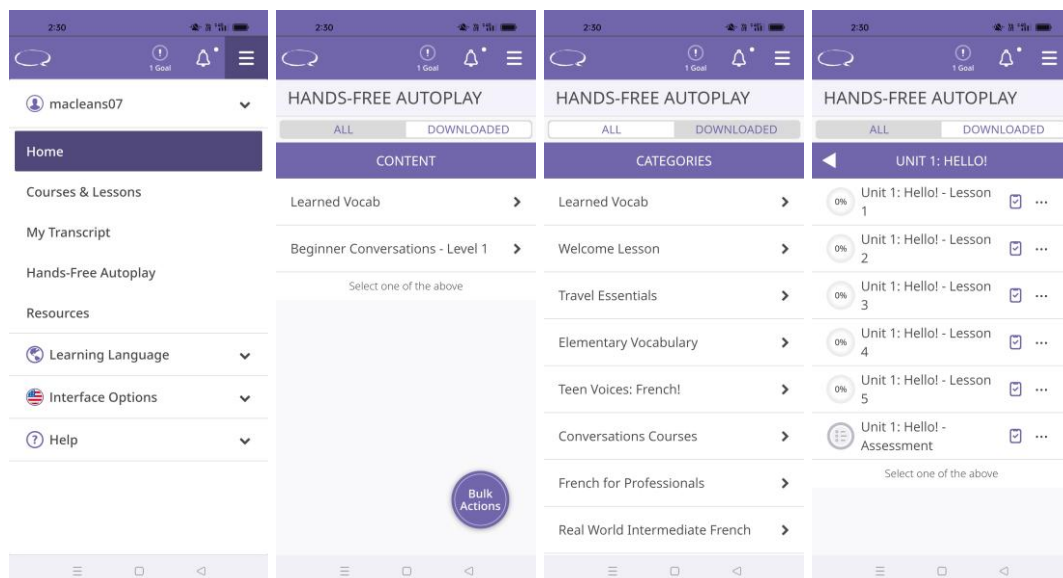
Under My Transcript is Hands-Free Autoplay. This lets you practice your language skills while on the go. It's designed for listening and speaking practice. This means you can use it during activities like driving or walking.

From the Learning Path on the Home page, tap on the three dots next to any lesson.

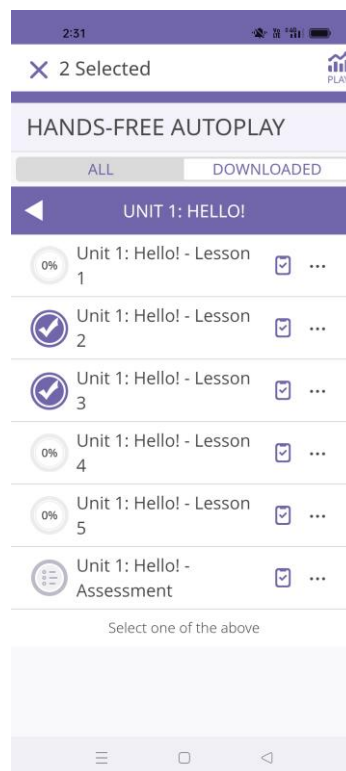
A Menu will open on your screen. From this Menu, tap **Download for Offline**. Confirm the download by tapping **Yes, Download to Device**. There will be a small checkmark icon next to downloaded lessons.



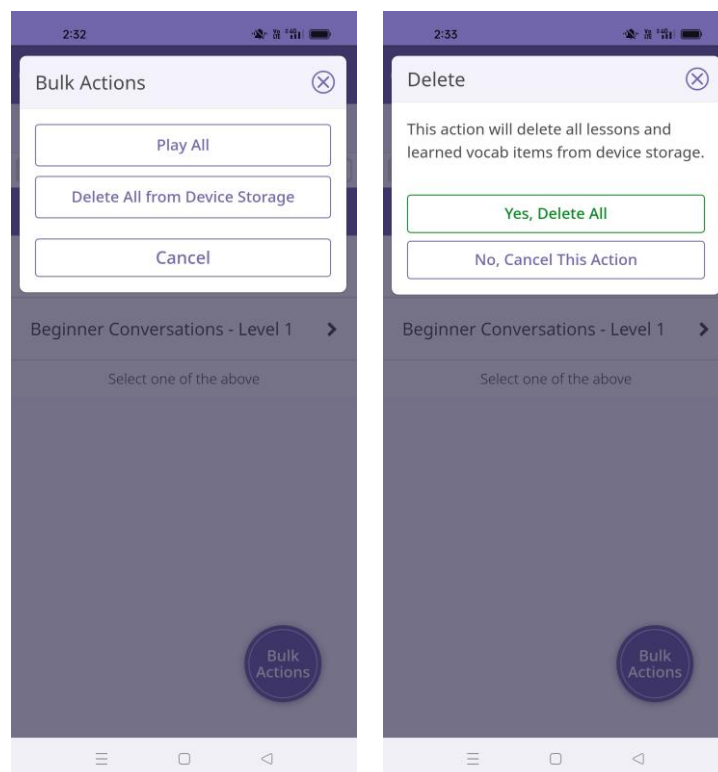
Tap on the Menu button in the top right corner of your screen. Select Hands-Free Autoplay from the Menu. Tap on the Unit and Lesson that you want to practice, and the activity will begin.



You can practice more than one lesson at a time. Press and hold a lesson name for one second until a checkmark appears next to it. This will add the lesson to your list. Tap as many as you want and press Play in the top right corner to start the lessons.



You can delete downloaded lessons by tapping on Bulk Actions in the first page of Autoplay. Tap **Delete All from Device Storage**, and then tap **Yes, Delete All**.
